Tulip Time Quilt & Cushion Pattern

Designed by Leesa Chandler and featuring her Culture Club's fabric range

"Dutch Cottage" for Robert Kaufman fabrics.

Show off your Dutch inspired fabrics in this easy to piece quilt and then complete the picture with the Dutch tile cushion, using your left overs!



Fabric Requirements

 Tulip Block Fabric (Red)
 12465-163 32" / 80cm
 Tile Fabric
 12463-163 24" / 60cm

 Tulip Tips & Sashing (Green)
 12141-46 30" / 75cm
 Background
 12469-14 60" / 1.5m

Floral Border fabric 12467-163 30" / 75cm

Note

Don't forget the cuppa rule, sit down with a cuppa and read the pattern from start to finish before you commence.

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances unless otherwise stated.

Quilt Cutting Requirements

Tulip Block fabric (Red)12465-163:cut sixteen4 ½" squarescut sixteen4 7/8" squarescut four2 ½" squares

Tulip Tips and Sashing fabric (Green) 12141-46: cut twenty 2 ½" squares

 cut four
 2 ½" x 18 ½" strips

 cut four
 2 ½" x 42 ½" strips

 cut eight
 6 ½" x 2 ½" strips

Tile fabric (Multi)

cut five

12463-163:
6 ½" squares

Floral fabric (Multi) 12467-163:

cut four 6 ½" x 42 ½" strips

Background fabric (Cream)12469-14:cut sixteen4 7/8" squarescut sixteen2 ½" x 4 ½" stripscut sixteen2 ½" squares

cut sixteen $2 \frac{1}{2} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips cut eight $2 \frac{1}{2} \times 18 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips

Cushions Cutting Requirements


From you leftover tile fabric, cut out nine tile shapes, adding a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to all sides.

From your background fabric, cut out nine pieces the same size as the tile shapes, and nine $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From your Sashing fabric, cut out six, 6 ½"x 1" strips and two, 19 ½" x 1" strips.

Method

1. Place pairs of $4^{7}/8$ " squares of Tulip fabric and Background fabric, right sides together. On one side, draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other.




- 2. Sew a 1/4" each side of the line as shown. Cut down the line to create two blocks.
- 3. Sew together 20 pairs of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares in Tulip Tip and Background fabric.
- 4. Using the diagram on the next page as a guide, piece the tulip flower sections using the pieces created above, the 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips of Background fabric and the 4 ½" squares of Tulip fabric.
- 5. Now piece the four main blocks in the quilt together as shown, using the 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of Background fabric and the remaining 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of Tulip tip fabric.
- 6. Piece the four main sashing sections together using the diagram on the next page as a guide. Each has two, 18 ½" x 2 ½" strips of background with one 18 ½" x 2 ½" strip of sashing fabric in the middle.
- 7. Piece two of these together with a 4 ½" Tile fabric square.
- 8. Then join the four main blocks together with your pieced sashing strips.
- 9. Use your 42 ½" x 2 ½" sashing strips and 2 ½" squares of Tulip fabric to border the quilt.
- 10. Add a 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing strip to each end of two of your 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " floral strips. Join to opposite sides of the quilt.
- 11. Join two 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of tile fabric, together with 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing strips and one 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " floral strip. Repeat for the other side of the quilt. Add to the opposite sides of the quilt to complete your quilt top. Once quilted, bind in tulip block fabric.



- 12. For your cushion top, pair up cut out tiles and matching background pieces, right sides together.
- 13. Sew right around each pair. Make a small slit in the middle on the background fabric side, turn right sides out and shape and press well.
- 14. Place a tile in the centre of each 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square of background fabric. Slip stitch in place if desired, or adhere or tack ready for quilting.
- 15. Join tile squares together in three rows of three, with 6 ½" x 1" sashing strips between them.

Then join the three rows together with the 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" sashing strips.



- 16. If you haven't stitched down your tiles as yet, you can now stitch then on at the same time you are quilting your cushion top. I chose to sew through the middle of each tile in both directions as shown in the diagram. This gives the tiles a 3D/free standing look on the cushion!
- 17. Place your cushion top right sides together with your chosen backing fabric (19 ½" square, sew around all sides leaving a 6" opening to turn through. Turn and fill, stitch opening closed.
